Students were provided with useful academic & curricular information at the end of assembly. The welcome assembly rejuvenated the students with vitality and exuberance.



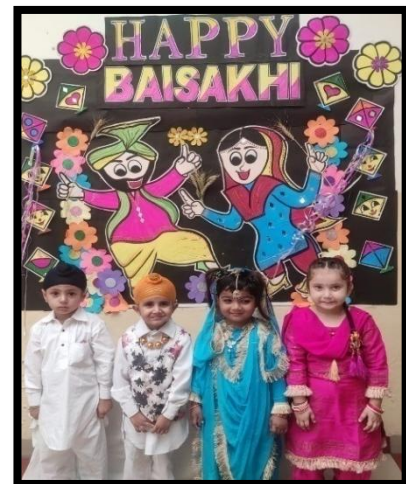
## Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Jayanti & Baisakhi-Festival of Harvest Celebration

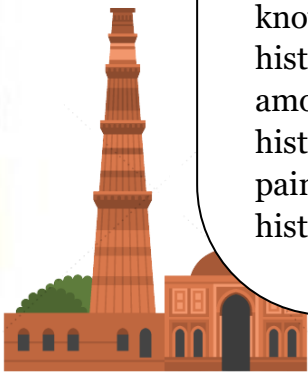
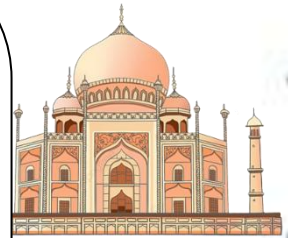




## World Heritage Day
