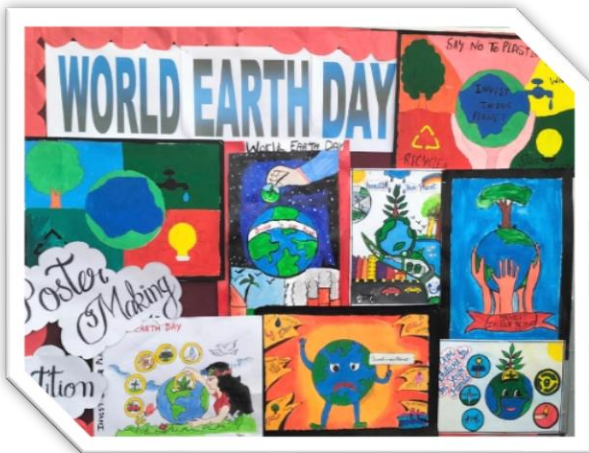
World Heritage Day

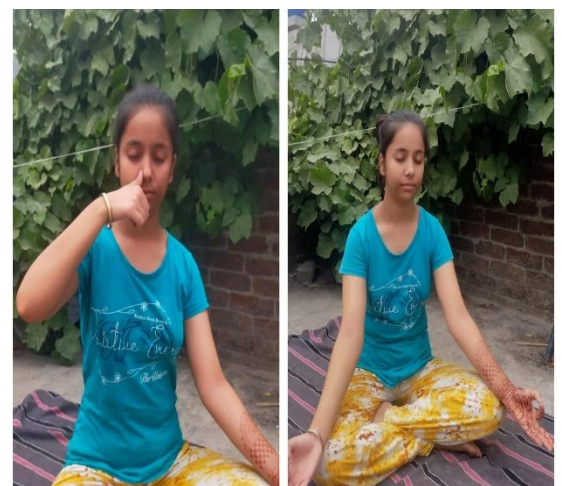
